

Who Does SouthPoint Support?



Introducing Lion Hearts Learning.

Lion Hearts Learning (LHL) is a South Australian registered children's charity that provides a free playgroup/pre-school service to children impacted by Cancer, whether it be their own, a

sibling's, or a parent's.

Children undergoing oncological treatment have severely compromised immune systems and must be kept quite isolated. As most other "main stream" services available to oncology children are aimed at older age brackets, we are filling a gap that is currently

not serviced but is very important.

How does SouthPoint support this charity?

Lion Hearts Learning are using SouthPoint premisses – Kids church in particular as one of their premisses to run their playgroups.

LHL ensures the environment is very clean/hygienic with all toys and resources being disinfected after each session and the venue fully cleaned before and after. No one can attend if they are sick. At the same time as being hygienic to the level that the children need, LHL provide social, emotional and educational (preparing for school) type learning that these children are not able to access due to their circumstances.

Children have the opportunity to make friends, be independent, make decisions and learn, which helps them to build confidence and self esteem, feel fulfilled, proud, happy and whole.

LHL gives parents an opportunity for respite, as they can leave children with a qualified staff. Range of activities such as jolly phonics, craft, storytelling, farm education, body movement, nutrition, socialisation, show and tell and more are explored during their sessions.

Services they currently provide are:

Face to face sessions on Mondays and Fridays from 9:30am to 12:30pm at their Central and Southern Branches.

Online sessions, Craft and Activity Packs are offered to children who are unable to attend due to being unwell, are in hospital or live too far away.

Lion Hearts send out about 30 Free craft packs each fortnight to children at home. Craft Items are always welcome.

LHL are also very active on Marketplace to raise funds for their operation.

New Members & Fellowship Lunch


During our service we welcomed eight new SouthPoint members. Welcome all, it is great having you as part of our community and worship together.

JO and daughter Codee-Jo (Their Story and How Lion Hearts Learning Started)

My daughter Codee-Jo Townsend was diagnosed with Leukaemia in April 2017 and it has been a roller coaster of emotions. We had to be brave in the face of sheer terror, provide laughter when wanting to cry and give meds at home while wanting to run to the hospital to ask nurses to do it. To date, in our lives, it has been the hardest experience so far. And since walking the journey, we've discovered so many families are in the same position.

Our whole world went from happy and normal to uncertain and out of control. Codee-Jo had tests after being sick, went into hospital and never came out. We were suddenly hit with the fear of losing a child, having to negotiate full time hospital rotation amongst looking after our other child, which meant giving up work and being hit financially. The emotional, financial, physical and mental impact was huge. The pain of watching Codee-Jo being injected regularly, given oral meds, going to theatre and being isolated was heartbreaking.

I am telling you this, not for sympathy, but to highlight the reality of the impact Cancer has on families. It is something no one ever expects, but many are forced to deal with.

We were lucky enough to have a village of support, who helped us. From caring for our son while we could not be with him, financially helping us, cooking meals, cleaning, rotating hospital care, supporting us and holding us up. We saw first-hand how important and life saving it was for us to have people help us. It was hard even with this, and we know that not every family gets the support we did.

When Codee-Jo had over a year to go of chemo every day, theatre monthly, bloods regularly, IV chemo every few weeks and low bloods, she had to stay clear of others so she didn't get sick, we really started to feel the need for social and educational learning for her.

Because kids with cancer often must be isolated from others as their immunity is so low, they cannot go to childcare, kindergarten or school when this happens.

For oncology kids the age of 2 to 5, there were little opportunities in South Australia for them to access social and educational opportunities that are germ free and safe for them to play.

For us, not only did we want something for our daughter, but after the kindness we were shown and the difference it made, we were inspired to give back to others in the same situation.

After research, there was one playgroup in Prospect. The structure, being a play type situation, we thought was wonderful. However, it was not easy for us to attend.

We thought it would be great to have something similar in the south of Adelaide also but more like an educational set up following the Early Years Learning framework and something where parents could leave and have respite. We realized the importance of parents having a break and regrouping so they could put their best foot forward as there is generally not much rest for parents.

So, we started Lion Hearts Learning.

Testimony from our Jolie

GOD IS GOOD! He definitely uses weird and wonderful ways to get our attention. In 2019 I had learnt that I was losing my job of 32 years. The last couple of years in that position were extremely busy and stressful; my work / life balance was well off kilter. For a long while I was distracted from God.

My immediate family's health throughout the course of our lives has been pretty good, aside from some heart disease in the extended family. This thought about my family history of good health always plagued me. Though I guestioned myself often, or maybe God, why this was the case. The answer never came so I just took it as a blessing. As an adult though, my parents' siblings were starting to have health issues including my Aunt who found a lump in one of her breasts. I finished up my job of 32 years on the 1st May 2020. It was that very weekend during COVID while we were having church services online, when we had a message from Jean Smith about relationship in Christ. I really felt the Lord speaking to me that this is the time. So, I decided to get up in the mornings with my husband, and while he was occupied, to spend some time with the Lord, reading the Bible and praying. On the Monday following this message, I got up and made myself comfortable. I wanted to put on some music to help inspire me, so I turned to YouTube and found a set of songs I liked. I cannot remember the name, but the first song was about Trust. I opened my bible, cannot remember what book or verse, again it was about trust! It was a very loud and clear message that I thought was about my job situation, not to be the case.

I was only off work about 7 weeks, when one night I was having trouble settling to sleep and happened to find a lump in the upper left-hand section of my left breast. Naturally, I went through the motions of making a Doctor's appointment and getting testing etc done. The diagnosis was positive for cancer, and that was only at the end of my very first week at a new job.

The shock almost seemed insurmountable for all four of us, but God immediately came into action. He surrounded us with people to talk, and talk we did. It was the one thing that got us through this weekend to share our news. A couple of weeks later I received the official diagnosis and action plan to go forward. I was to have surgery and then go onto chemotherapy and radio therapy. God did truly bless us by surrounding us with plenty of support. Particularly following surgery where people from both our church homes brought us meals and an offer to refresh my garden.

More importantly I received an invitation to join Compass, a cancer support group run by our very own Robyn Combes. In this group were Christian and non-Christian ladies. The group provided me a place to share my heart and thoughts throughout my treatment journey. Again, something God knew I needed.

Toward the end of my chemotherapy treatment, I started having anxiety about reoccurrence of cancer. Sometime later I got a phone call from a new friend who has been through her own health ordeal who said she had a gift for me. She had been to the Christian bookshop in the city with a couple of friends and told me that she was wanting to get something for me - tossing up between two items with a different bible verse on them. The bookmark she ended up giving me had Jeremiah 29:11 on it, given the relevance it had for her. The following morning, I was thinking about this verse but had forgotten the Bible reference thinking it was Philippians 4:6 on the bookmark.

So, I looked up this verse and what it is about...that is right! Being anxious for nothing. I went back to check the scripture on the bookmark and realised that God was again speaking to me. Being anxious for nothing also means trusting Him.

I have finished the worst of my treatment now and look forward to 'a new normality' for a while. Throughout this journey God has brought me closer to him, strengthened my faith and taught me many things. No matter what the circumstance, the Bible is truly alive, and I am continually amazed by that.
